








What Rogue Group do you attend or receive information from (check those that apply)?




Approximately how far do you need to travel to attend Rogue Group meetings?




# How many times have you attended a Rogue Group Meeting?




Which of the following do you gain from attending Rogue Group meetings? (Select all that apply.)

The opportunity to share/network with those closest to us.

I most enjoy the fellowship of colleagues who face the same challenges I do as a one-person communications department -- they "get it." I most benefit from our problem-solving discussions and how generously my colleagues share resources.

Informal sharing of best practices and what is happening in other districts. Little formal agenda time, and more about sharing out and getting ideas.

These meetings are such a great learning opportunity for me. I often walk away with a great idea to come back and implement in my district.

The greatest benefit is the opportunity to hear how nearby districts handled a challenge or opportunity. Also, when I share what my district has done, it is great to get feedback from others who I trust, helping me consider other potential strategies and solutions going forward. We also help group members brainstorm options for issues they are currently facing. The bonds built at the Rogue Group meetings create natural connections for those cases when, in the heat of a crisis, I need a quick professional opinion before pushing out information to our district families.

Because we are smaller schools, and all 1 man shops, it's nice to talk about things that happen in smaller school districts. We aren't always dealing with the much bigger, sometimes political issues that the bigger school districts/cities are facing. These people in my Rogue Group have become not just colleagues, but friends as well.

How to easily implement ideas shared

This is my team! We share ideas, successes, and failures with each other. There is a high level of trust with this group and it is where innovation is spread.

Seeing what my colleagues are doing in our area since our big MOSPRA group is normally 3-5 years ahead of us.

Hearing all different opinions

I have gotten so many ideas on promoting my school by listening to what others are doing. Jill is a great facilitator and our group is very productive
